Aquarium

An aquarium is a tank of water to keep live fish, water creatures and plants.

Dolphin

A sea mammal that is intelligent and playful



Topic: Let's go to an aquarium (Part One)

Shark

A shark is a very large fish with sharp teeth that eats meat (carnivorous). Sharks are dangerous.

Seahorse

A small fish with a head that looks like a horse and that swims upright.

Sea Turtle

A turtle has a large shell and looks like a tortoise.

Octopus

An octopus is a sea creature that has eight arms and a big head.

Star Fish

A flat sea creature with five arms shaped like a star.

Manta Ray

A large flat sea fish that has fins that look like wings. Rays are quiet and peaceful and are not dangerous.

Fish

A fish have scales and fins. They live in water and breathe through their gills.

Eel

A fish with a long body, that looks like a snake. An eel has very sharp teeth.

Fact Tank

Let's match the fun facts to the correct sea creature.

Grammar focus - Let's revise adjectives?

Adjectives are **describing words**. They tell us more about the noun. Adjectives and nouns work together to make reading and writing more fun.



Topic: Let's go to an aquarium (Part One)

Like this.....

This is a **crab**. (The **noun** is crab)

Now let's use some adjectives (describing words) to tell us more about the noun (the crab).

This is a **small**, **bright orange**, **scary looking** crab. (The words **small**, **bright orange**, **scary looking**, are all **<u>adjectives</u>**).

Now let's look at the sea creatures in the tanks and use some <u>adjectives</u> to describe what they look like. (It will help if you look at the size, shape, colour, patterns and quantity and use these to describe what you see).














COLOR FUN - PART TWO - TROPICAL FISH
